Work In Progress

SKMG is presently working in Northern Alberta as a General Contractor, for the Village Of Chateh, DENE THA' First Nation, constructing a new state of the art water treatment plant. The Project commenced on July 2009 and is scheduled to be complete in May 2010. The total contract value for this project is \$10,000,000. This project is also being constructed with assistance in labour and sub-trades provided by the DENE THE' First Nation. Heart Lake Community Centre is the second project that SKMG is presently working. On this design-built project SKMG works very close with Heart Lake First Nation. Project consist commercial kitchen, healings room and class rooms for continuing education. The project commenced on July 2009 and is scheduled to be complete in June 2010. The total contract value for this project is \$2,000,000.

Completed First Nation Projects

Throughout the design and construction of each of the following projects, SKMG works diligently with each First Nation to insure that the completed projects work for the nation. We design and build these buildings with the past, the present and the future is mind. We enlist the help of Band members, community leaders, elders and Spiritual leaders to ensure that nothing is over looked or left out of completed projects. SKMG feels strongly that by making each and every project a truly community minded project the facility once completed will be respected and appreciated more so than if we were to simply hire architects and engineers and design and construct a building. We actually force our subcontractors to hire local Band members, to create on Reserve employment and we partake in Training Programs where and whenever possible.

Water treatment Plants

We have been involved with the design and construction of water plants for Chateh and DENE THA' First Nation. Basically they are water plants that are designed and constructed to meet or exceed the requirements of Indian and Northern Affairs and Health Canada. They are built with ten years population growth in mind. Our water plants are spacious and designed with an office for the operator, a washroom, and workroom area. We feel that one of the problems with water plants on reserves is that they tend to be cramped areas that do not lend for an operator to be on site. Our plants are painted and in some way welcoming, so that the plant operator actually enjoys being in the building.
